He is now Director of Music at The Brompton Oratory, London, and Director of The Cardinall's Musick. He pursues an active and varied conducting career which includes lecturing in England and the United States, and as a singer performs frequently with all of the major early music groups as soloist and consort singer. He makes regular appearances on BBC Radio 3 and has recently recorded a number of discs: for ASV he has now recorded the complete festal masses and antiphons of Nichlas Ludford and Robert Fayrfax, as well as Merbecke, Cornysh and others. Earlier this year, the first in a series of the complete works of William Byrd was released with The Cardinall's Musick. He received the Gramophone Award for Early Music in 1995.

CHRISTOPHER BOOTH-JONES was born in Somerset and studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London. he started his operatic career touring with Welsh National Opera For All, and moved from there to sing most of the major Baritone roles for Welsh National Opera itself, Glyndebourne Festival and Touring Opera and Kent Opera. In 1975 he made his proms debut, and the next year joined the English Music Theatre, moving in 1983 to English National Opera where he has added to his impressive repertory of major roles.

Engagements both here and abroad have included appearances at leading concert halls, cathedrals and festivals all over Britain and Europe, regular broadcasts for BBC Radio 3, Radio 2 and Radio 4, Radio France and Belgian Radio. He performs all the main oratorio and concert repertory, lieder, English Song, opera and operetta as well as some less usual works, and there are a number of audio and video recordings of his performances available.

After a Modern Languages degree at Clare College, Cambridge, where she was a choral scholar under Timothy Brown, she took up a place at the Royal College of Music to study singing with Neil Mackie.
