## RAMME

The four Coronation Anthems by George Frederich Handel were written for the coronation of George II in 1727. They are a remarkable collection which clearly display Handel's mastery as a composer of music for a Royal occasion. Handel successfully complements the pomp and ceremony of a coronation with carefully crafted building up of tension such as the opening of *Zadok the Priest* and the sheer exuberance of *The King shall rejoice*.

Vaughan Williams' setting of the words *O Taste and See* from psalm 34 are in stark contrast to the glories of Handel. A very simple yet highly effective composition which utilises solo voice and chorus. Very subtle yet hauntingly beautiful, *O Taste and See* was composed for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953. In contrast to this is his robust setting of the hymn *Old 100th* composed for the same occasion, which we hope you will join with us in singing.

Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace by Samuel Sebastian Wesley and I was glad by Sir Hubert Parry were also composed for Queen Elizabeth's coronation and are established works of the English choral repertoire. In particular, I was glad has come to epitomise the celebration and ceremony of an English coronation.

The Cherwell Singers was founded in 1978 by a group of singers who wished to perform the vocal chamber music repertory, and several of the original singers are still part of the choir. Our repertory covers sacred and secular music from the late Medieval period to 20th-century works (some written especially for the choir), and includes not only central compositions of the choral repertory but many lesser-known pieces. The choir accepts bookings for weddings, dinners and other events, formal and informal, and we welcome enquiries from prospective new members.
